The next stage of the Mount Pleasant Optimisation Project

The Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) has completed its assessment of the Mount Pleasant Optimisation Project and has referred it to the NSW Independent Planning Commission (IPC) for determination.

Copies of the DPE's Assessment report and proposed draft consent conditions can be found on the IPC's website:

The IPC is a standalone decision-making body and operates independently from the DPE. The IPC was established as a consent authority to determine State Significant Developments (like the Project) in 2018.

As part of the Project determination process the IPC will conduct a public hearing and also consider submissions on the proposal. The IPC has indicated that the public hearing for the Project will occur on 7 & 8 July 2022, and the hearing will be conducted

remotely by electronic means and live streamed on the IPC website.



MACH Energy encourages interested employees, contractors, members of the public and community organisations to make submissions to the IPC on the Project.

The IPC submissions deadline is 15 July 2022.

The IPC process will be an opportunity for the community to comment on or discuss the Project in a transparent forum, so if you're having any trouble lodging a submission, please feel free to give us a call on **1800 886 889** and we can run you through the process.

Determination of the Optimisation Project by the IPC is anticipated to occur this year. MACH Energy will continue to consult with key NSW Government agencies, Councils, and the public regarding the Optimisation Project as the approvals process continues.
