SSD Update

The NSW Independent Planning Commission (IPC) approved the Mount Pleasant Optimisation Project with conditions on 6 September 2022, following a public hearing held in July 2022. The final Consent Conditions, Public Hearing Transcript and submissions to the IPC regarding the Project can be found on the IPC's website:

MACH Energy would like to thank all community members who participated in the IPC process, and particularly the 680+ people and organizations who supported the Project via a positive submission.

Prior to MACH commencing on-site activities in support of the Project, the next step in the approvals process is determination of the proposal under the Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act). MACH Energy anticipates that the Federal Minister for the Environment and Water will determine the Project proposal under the EPBC Act in either Quarter 3 or Quarter 4 of 2023.

Modification 6

MACH Energy has lodged an application to modify its Development Consent DA 92/97 under section 4.55 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (NSW) (EP&A Act), which will be known as "Modification 6".

Modification 6 will allow for the construction and operation of a re-transmission facility including a tower or mast, shed and associated transmission infrastructure, to re-transmit local digital television signals from the existing Broadcast Australia site at Rossgole Lookout. The re-transmission facility would allow for the strength and quality of local digital television signals to be maintained as the Mount Pleasant Operation continues to operate.



Andrew delivers a gold medal performance in France


