Milestones & updates



As we approach the end of 2019, construction is now complete on the coal handling preparation plant (CHPP) and the first washed coal was processed in late October. Mining operations are moving to the north west with pit development continuing. The Geofluv landform shaping is now complete for Stage 2 and Stage 3 work has commenced near Wybong Road. Topsoil spreading has commenced on Stage 1 and Stage 2 in preparation for seeding.

SSD Update

MACH Energy is currently in the process of preparing its Optimisation Project Scoping Report to submit to the NSW Government, the initial step in a new State Significant Development (SSD) application for the Mount Pleasant Operation. The Optimisation Project Scoping Report will build on initial community and regulatory consultation conducted in late 2019, and will present project description information to inform the issue of the NSW Government requirements for the comprehensive Environmental Impact Statement studies that will continue in 2020.
